

Our reports on federal employee presence by state and congressional district are population estimates from the US Census Bureau's 2022 American Community Survey.

The American Community Survey (ACS) is a nationwide survey designed to provide communities a fresh look at how they are changing. The ACS eliminated the need for a decennial census long form in 2010. The ACS collects long form type information (e.g., employment, migration, educational attainment, veteran status, etc.) throughout the decade, publishing statistics yearly rather than only once every 10 years. The American Community Survey collects data throughout the year in every county in the United States and every municipality in Puerto Rico. Statistics from the ACS are released in the form of 1-year and 5-year estimates. NTEU uses the counts of federal employees from the ACS as the most reliable count of where federal employees live and vote, rather than where federal employees work.
