

Impact of Federal Government on the Alaska Economy

Dedicated federal employees serve the American public from coast to coast. The federal employees who live in work in Alaska are part of the 85% of federal workers who live and work outside of Washington D.C.

In 2024 there were an estimated **22,529** federal employees living in Alaska, representing **6.6%** of the civilian workforce, with an average salary of **\$99,398**.
