

Impact of the Federal Government on the Minnesota Economy

Dedicated federal employees serve the American public from coast to coast. The federal employees who live in work in Minnesota are part of the 85% of federal workers who live and work outside of the Washington D.C. area.

In 2024 there were an estimated 48,322 federal employees living in the state, representing 1.6% of the Minnesota civilian workforce, with an average salary of \$102,843.





