

Impact of the Federal Government on the Mississippi Economy

Dedicated federal employees serve the American public from coast to coast. The federal employees who live in work in Mississippi are part of the 85% of federal workers who live and work outside of the Washington D.C. area.

In 2024 there were an estimated 43,661 federal employees living in the state, representing 3.3% of the Mississippi civilian workforce, with an average salary of \$89,320.




