

Impact of Federal Government on the Nevada Economy

Dedicated federal employees serve the American public from coast to coast. The federal employees who live and work in Nevada are part of the 85% of federal workers who live and work outside of Washington D.C.

In 2024 there were an estimated **40,679** federal employees living in the state, representing **2.5%** of the Nevada civilian workforce, with an average salary of **\$97,929**.
