

U.S. HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

VOTING RECORD -- 110TH CONGRESS, FIRST SESSION

House Vote #1 - HR 800: Employee Union Card Check - Passage

March 01, 2007 - Passage of the bill that would allow workers to form a union by petition ("majority card-check") rather than being forced to use the tainted NLRB. Also increases the fines on companies using illegal anti-worker tactics against union organizing. Passed 241-185.

NTEU Position: YES

House Vote #2 - HR 1905: District of Columbia Voting Rights - Passage

April 19, 2007 - Passage of the bill that would permanently increase the membership of the House of Representatives to 437, by granting a seat to the District of Columbia and an additional seat to Utah. Both seats would be filled by special election. The bill also would add one seat for Utah to the electoral college so there would be 539 votes. A non-severability clause provides that if any provision is invalidated by a court, all remaining provisions would also be invalid. Passed 241-177.

NTEU Position: YES

House Vote #3 - HR 2638: Fiscal 2008 Homeland Security Appropriations - Personnel Management System

June 15, 2007 - McCaul, R-Texas, amendment that would strike a provision that would prohibit the obligation of funds, until all pending litigation and claims filed by either party are resolved, for the development, testing, deployment or operation of systems relating to the MaxHR personnel management system or any related human resources system. Rejected 184-238.

NTEU Position: NO

House Vote #4 - HR 2638: Fiscal 2008 Homeland Security Appropriations - Airport Screeners

June 15, 2007 - Rogers, R-Ky., amendment that would bar the use of funds in the bill to recruit or hire more than 45,000 full-time airport screeners.

Rejected 168-255.

House Vote #5 - HR 2829: Fiscal 2008 Financial Services Appropriations - Converting Federal Job Functions

June 28, 2007 - Price, R-Ga., amendment that would strike a provision in the bill that would restrict the government's ability to contract out current federal job functions under A-76. Rejected 158-268.

NTEU Position: NO

House Vote #6 - HR 2829: Fiscal 2008 Financial Services Appropriations - Across-the-Board Cut

June 28, 2007 - Jordan, R-Ohio, amendment that would reduce discretionary funding in the bill by 8.9 percent. The bill included funding for the Treasury Department, FEC, FCC and SEC. Rejected 149-276.

NTEU Position: NO

House Vote #7 - HR 3043: Fiscal 2008 Labor-HHS-Education Appropriations - Across-the-Board Cut

July 19, 2007 - Jordan, R-Ohio, amendment that would require a 4.6 percent across-the-board cut in discretionary spending, which includes funding for the Department of Health and Human Services and the Social Security Administration. Rejected 136-288.

NTEU Position: NO

House Vote #8 - HR 2831: Wage Discrimination ("Lilly Ledbetter Act") - Passage

July 31, 2007 - Passage of the bill that would amend the 1964 Civil Rights Act to allow employees to file charges of pay discrimination within 180 days of the last received paycheck affected by the alleged discriminatory decision. The bill would clarify that an employee is entitled to up to two years of back-pay if it is determined that discrimination occurred. Passed 225-199.

NTEU Position: YES.

House Vote #9 - HR 3161: Fiscal 2008 Agriculture/FDA Appropriations - Rule

August 02, 2007 - Adoption of the rule (H Res 599) to provide for House floor consideration of the bill that would appropriate \$90.7 billion in fiscal 2008 for the Department of Agriculture and related agencies such as the Food and Drug Administration. The rule contains language, that upon adoption, would incorporate a number of items into the bill including prohibiting the use of funds to terminate or consolidate certain FDA field laboratories. Adopted 224-194.

NTEU Position: YES

House Vote #10 - HR 3056: Private Tax Collection - Passage

October 10, 2007 - Passage of the bill that would rescind the authority of the IRS to enter into contracts with private companies to collect debts. The bill includes several provisions to offset costs, including a new tax on individuals who renounce their American citizenship for purpose of tax avoidance. Passed 232-173.

NTEU Position: YES.

House Vote #11 - HR 3685: Employee Non-Discrimination - Passage

November 07, 2007 - Passage of the bill that would prohibit job discrimination on the basis of an individual's actual or perceived sexual orientation. An employee who alleged discrimination would be required to demonstrate that the nature of the discrimination was intentional. The protections would apply to employers, employment agencies, labor organizations and joint labor-management committees but would exempt religious organizations. It also would specify that the bill would not alter the federal definition of marriage as being between a man and woman. Passed 235-184.

NTEU Position: YES.

House Vote #12 - HR 3996: Alternative Minimum Tax Adjustment - Passage

November 09, 2007 - Passage of the bill that would provide a one-year adjustment to exempt an additional 21 million taxpayers from paying the alternative minimum tax on income from 2007. It would also rescind the authority of the IRS to enter into contracts with private companies to collect debts. Passed 216-193.

VOTING RECORD – 110TH CONGRESS, FIRST SESSION

Vote #1 - HR 2: Minimum Wage Increase - Cloture

January 24, 2007 - Motion to invoke cloture (to stop a filibuster) on the bill that would increase the minimum wage to \$7.25 per hour over two years. Motion rejected 54-43.

Note: Three-fifths of the total Senate (60) is required to invoke cloture.

NTEU Position: YES

Vote #2 - S 4: Sept. 11 Commission Recommendations - Collective Bargaining

March 06, 2007 - Reid, D-Nev., motion to table (kill) the DeMint, R-S.C., amendment to the Reid substitute amendment. The DeMint amendment would strike a provision in the bill that would extend collective bargaining rights and greater whistleblower protections to Transportation Security Administration (TSA) screeners. Motion agreed to 51-46.

NTEU Position: YES.

Vote #3 - S 4: Sept. 11 Commission Recommendations - Collective Bargaining

March 07, 2007 - McCaskill, D-Mo., amendment to the Reid, D-Nev., substitute amendment. The McCaskill amendment would grant Transportation Security Administration (TSA) screeners limited collective bargaining rights. Adopted 51-48.

NTEU Position: YES

Vote #4 - S Con Res 21: Fiscal 2008 Budget Resolution - Social Security

Privatization

March 22, 2007 - DeMint, R-S.C., amendment that would use Social Security funds invested for future retirees to create private accounts. The amendment would increase the federal debt by over \$700 billion over ten years. Rejected 45-52.

Vote #5 - S Con Res 21: Fiscal 2008 Budget Resolution - Adoption

March 23, 2007 - Adoption of the concurrent resolution that would set broad spending and revenue targets over the next five years. The resolution would allow up to approximately \$948.8 billion in discretionary spending for fiscal 2008. Adopted 52-47.

Vote #6 - HR 800: Employee Free Choice - Cloture

June 26, 2007 - Motion to invoke cloture (to stop a filibuster) on the Reid, D-Nev., motion to proceed to the bill that would allow workers to form a union by petition (“majority card check”) rather than being forced to use the tainted NLRB process. Also increases fines on companies using illegal anti-worker tactics against union organizing. Motion rejected 51-48: R 1-48. **Note:** Three-fifths of the total Senate (60) is required to invoke cloture.

Vote #7 - S 1257: District of Columbia Voting Rights - Cloture

September 18, 2007 - Motion to invoke cloture (to stop a filibuster) on the Reid, D-Nev., motion to proceed to the bill that would increase the membership of the House of Representatives to 437, by granting a seat to the District of Columbia and an additional seat to Utah. Motion rejected 57-42: **Note:** Three-fifths of the total Senate (60) is required to invoke cloture.

Vote #8 - HR 3043: Fiscal 2008 Labor-HHS-Education Appropriations - Social Security Administration

October 23, 2007 - Bingaman, D-N.M., amendment to the Harkin, D-Iowa, substitute amendment. The Bingaman amendment would increase by \$150 million the amount appropriated for the Social Security Administration's administrative expenses account. NTEU represented employees at SSA need additional employees to process disability insurance claims. This funding would hire additional staff. Adopted 88-6.

Vote #9 - HR 3996: Alternative Minimum Tax Adjustment - Cloture

December 06, 2007 - Motion to invoke cloture (to stop a filibuster) on the Reid, D-Nev., motion to proceed to the bill that would provide a one-year adjustment to exempt an additional 21 million taxpayers from paying the alternative minimum tax on income from 2007. It also would end the private tax collection program at the IRS. Motion rejected 46-48. **Note:** Three-fifths of the total Senate (60) is required to invoke cloture.
