WHY SHOULD YOU VOTE?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2020, only 66.8% of the voting-age population in the United States reported voting.

Modern technology has improved access to information on candidates and made it easier to register to vote in many areas, and it is vital to be aware of how you can participate in the 2024 election cycle.



UTAH'S ABSENTEE AND MAIL-IN VOTING PROCEDURES

Permanent absentee/ mail-in voting procedures:

- Ballots are delivered to all voters



UTAH'S EARLY VOTING DEADLINES

Early Voting **Begins:** **October 22**

Early Voting **Ends:** **November 1**

DEADLINES TO KNOW FOR VOTING IN UTAH



VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE:

October 25

Eleven days before an election. Same-day registration is permitted during early voting and on Election Day.



ABSENTEE / MAIL-IN VOTING BALLOT DEADLINES:

Request must be received by

Application Not Required

Application Not Required [All Mail]



BALLOT SUBMISSION DEADLINE:

Must be received by the close of polls on Election Day or postmarked the day before Election Day.

Postmarked by Election Day

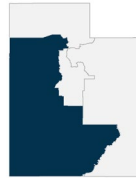
